## **Emergency Project Description**

On March 1, 2025, a large sinkhole formed on NYS Route 56 in the Town of Colton, resulting in one travel lane becoming impassable. It has been determined that the existing 100-foot-long, 5-foot by 5-foot box culvert has become compromised and must be replaced. The proposed project involves the replacement of the existing 5-foot by 5-foot box culvert with a 12-foot by 7-foot box culvert, on an alignment adjacent to the existing culvert.

This Emergency Certificate does not convey any right to trespass upon the lands or interfere with the riparian rights of others in order to undertake the work authorized herein, nor does it authorize the impairment of any easement, right, title, or interest in real or personal property.
