Guidelines for Management and Use Basic guidelines

Primary management guideline:

- public opportunities
- in a setting and scale in harmony with the relatively wild and undeveloped character



Guidelines for Management and Use Basic guidelines

All intensive use facilities should be located, designed and managed:

- blend with the Adirondack environment;
- minimum adverse impact on surrounding state and private lands;



Guidelines for Management and Use Basic guidelines

Construction and development activities will:

- avoid wetlands;
- minimize topographic alterations;
- limit vegetative clearing;
- preserve the scenic, natural and open space resources of the intensive use area.

- Rustic nature
- Natural character
- Natural materials






Fish Creek Pond Campground



Proposed Management Actions – 1. Replace six comfort stations



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

• 2. Reconstruct roads to accommodate two-way traffic and repave








Proposed Management Actions 5. Reconstruct boat launch in day use area





Campgrounds

1....Where a campground involves the shoreline of a lake, pond, river or major stream any new, reconstructed or relocated camping sites will be set back a minimum of 100 feet from the mean high water mark and will be located so as to be reasonably screened from the shoreline and so as to avoid intruding on its natural character or public enjoyment and use thereof.
