


## TAKEAWAYS


Collaborative, sciencebased approaches are critical to addressing environmental challenges.

### MAPPING FOREST CARBON

 Aid staff in identifying areas where solar energy development may be suitable by highlighting land cover that has high carbon sequestration or storage value.



### MAPPING DEEPWATER MARSHES




 Monitor ecological changes, assist with managing aquatic invasive species, and protect habitat from degradation, ensuring sustainable natural resource management in the Park.

### PUBLIC LANDS FOR ALL

- Started year with Classification Package, led into SLMP amendments.
- Robust public engagement with hearings.
- Received over **1,200** public comments
- Underscores value of the process to the Agency.

- Over 250 attendees at the 2024 Adirondack Planning Forum
- Brought together stakeholders to learn about and find solutions to the Park's biggest issues






### STAFFING

- 30% staffing increase in two years.
- Reversing a nearly twodecade decline.
- Additions and promotions in all divisions.
- Aiming for 59 FTEs in 2025.




### TELECOMMUNICATIONS


- Increased telecommunication coverage in 2024 with continued uptick in Small Cell Technology.
- General Permit 2023G-1 streamlines collocation.
- To date, the Agency has successfully approved 590 permits for telecommunication projects.


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### WETLANDS

### 2024 Adirondack Park nitiwa 💁 **Agency Wetland Site** Visits 2024 Wetland

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
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Site Visits Park Boundary Blueline

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### PERMITTING

- Over 3x increase in Emergency Authorizations— from 9 to 30.
- Climate change drivestorms increasing in frequency and severity.
- Allows communities to immediately address storm impacts

### ENFORCEMENT

- Nearly doubled settlement agreements signed.
- Increased voluntary compliance by 30%
- The majority of enforcement cases involved wetlands and shorelines.
- A new process for permit compliance has supported these outcomes.
